It is your counsel, generous support and prayers that has enables us to successfully continue and meet the vision and mission of our founder Dr. Pauline E. King and the institution.

I would like to begin my report by personally acknowledging and thanking our Principal sponsors the Global Ministries, USA, St. John's Church, Alresford UK, Mr. John Ramsbottom & Friends, (Friends of Kasam, UK), Mr. Harold Mondol, USA, Individual sponsors and donors abroad and our many friends from the CMCH and Vellore community for their generous support in cash and kind.

This year was a significant one in the history of MBKG Pannai because in February 2019, the organization completed 50 years of service to the destitute community. On the 18<sup>th</sup> of February, at 6 pm in the main campus, a grand celebration was organized by the organization to mark this great event. We thank the Almighty God for His divine, guidance, providence, blessings and benevolence of His people.

#### 1. HOME

We are glad to report that we are making continuous efforts to improve the quality of life of our children and grandparents. Our house mothers are daily motivated and encouraged to render good care for the children and the elders. Our grandparents maintain good health with regular medication and periodical check-up. As our grandparents are aging fast the responsibility of taking care of them is becoming a big challenge. We are striving hard to provide quality care for each of them. This year, four children, one house mother and one grandparent were admitted to the home.

The organization has under its care 183 children from the ages of 6 months to 21 years, 12 House Mothers and 21 Grandparents living together in 8 cottages, a nursery and a boys' hostel.

#### **1-01 Integrated Complex**

MBKG Pannai continues to be the best 'Integrated Complex of Special Homes for Senior Citizens and Destitute Children' in Vellore District. There are periodical visits carried out by the Child Welfare Committee, District Child Protection Unit along with the District Social Welfare officer to inspect the place, residents and records. It stands to the credit of the staff for their great effort in maintaining the required standards and documentation for this award being given to the MBKG Pannai for the 7<sup>th</sup> year in a row.

In September 2018, Mrs. Kannegi Packianathan, IAS (r), Chairperson of Tamil Nadu State Commission for women visited the Home and was impressed with the functioning of the organization.

On December 25<sup>th</sup>, Mr. Aasaithambi, the Additional Superintendent of Police, Vellore and his team visited the Home.

### District Collector's Visit on World Elder Abuse Awareness Day

The Vellore district Collector Mr. S.A. Raman visited the Home on June 15 to commemorate the World Elder Abuse Awareness Day. The programme was organized by the Social Welfare Board to create awareness among youngsters. The Collector was accompanied by the District Social Welfare Board Officer. He flagged off the procession and along with the government officials, staff of the Home and the children took an oath against elder abuse. Later, he honoured the elders with a shawl individually, interacted with them and visited their rooms. The programme was started with Tamil Thai Vazhthu (Invocation to Mother Tamil and the state song of Tamil Nadu) and ended with the national anthem.

#### 1-03 Education

- No. of Home children studying from LKG to 12<sup>th</sup> grade at King's Matriculation Hr. Sec. School is **144**.
- This academic year 15 of our Home children appeared for 12<sup>th</sup> grade board examination and 11 got through successfully with good marks.
- In the **10<sup>th</sup>grade** board examination, out of **10** students from the Home, **9** children got through successfully. Among the 9, 7 joined 11<sup>th</sup> grade at King's School and 2 children joined ITI.

#### **Higher Education**

After completing 12<sup>th</sup> grade, our children are enrolled to professional and Vocational training course depending on their academic performances and interests.

When our children reach the age of 18, they cease to receive sponsorship money but we continue to support their higher education which includes professional, vocational or technical courses. We are in a difficult situation here as these courses are very expensive. For this reason, we have created a **Scholarship Endowment Fund for Higher Education** to help us meet these expenses. We thank the donors and sponsors who have helped us to meet our higher educational expenses and we earnestly seek your prayers and support in building up this fund.

We have done our best to ensure that every child has some professional / Vocational training to meet the challenges of facing life outside the Institution after their discharge from the Home. This is a dramatic change that has taken place in the last 20 years. I would like to place on record the remarkable support we get from the College of Nursing at CMC for the training of our children since 2002. I wish to thank the Former Dean Dr. Mrs. Selva Chacko Titus and the present Dean Dr. Mrs. Vathsala Sadan and every member of our society from the nursing college for this great support.

#### **Prayer fellowship and Scripture Classes**

Scripture classes are held on evenings of Mondays, Tuesdays, and first Saturdays. The children are taught bible stories and songs by different groups of missionaries from Vellore such as Bro. Yesurajan, Bible Centered Ministries, Bro. Joseph & Team, Monday Prayer Fellowship and Bro. John Reuben, Youth for Christ.

Regular Sunday Morning Worship Services are conducted at the campus and on first Sunday of the month Holy Communion Service is conducted by the Presbyter, CSI Church, Kasam. On Sunday evenings, children attend Sunday school conducted by wardens and tutors.

Weekly Prayer Fellowship for House mothers and elders are conducted by Rev. Walter Sunder Singh, Fishing for Christ Ministries, Ranipet and Sisters of Shilo Ministries, Vellore.

#### **1-04 Holiday Activities**

#### Children's visit to their Homes

At the end of the academic year when the school is closed for annual holiday in the month of May, Children with families are sent to their homes for a week as part of summer program. This is an integral part of our program as it helps children keep in touch with their immediate family and also helps them understand the value of good opportunities at MBKG Pannai. Children who stay in other hostels and study at residential colleges also visit MBKG Pannai during their annual holiday.

#### Vacation Bible School

The annual VBS was held at the Home campus from April 21 to April 29. We registered 200 children. It was conducted by Scripture Union and the theme for 2019 was "Unmasked!! Remove Masks – Receive Blessings" based on the scripture verse from Ephesians 4:22. On the

final day of the VBS, a grand programme was organized. The children displayed their talents in skits, songs, reciting memory verses and other competitions. All participants and winners of the competitions were awarded with certificates and prizes.

#### Summer Camp

The 2019 annual summer camp was held from May 21 to May 26 at CSI Polytechnic College, Salem. Children above 13 years of age were taken for the camp. Over 5 days, the children were spiritually enlightened by team of ministers from A group of ministers headed by Bro. ### 1-08 Health and Nutrition

The children, mothers and grandparents continue to be in good health. Routine medical check-up for the grandparents are done at S.I.H – R & L.C, Hospital, Karigiri and Government Primary Health Center Thiruvalam. We follow a scheduled well balanced food menu, a daily multivitamin tablet and a fruit three times a week for the children, mothers and grandparents. Once in 6 months de-worming and quarterly weight and height check are being done to monitor children's growth.

We thank the government Primary Health Centre for supplying sanitary pads for the children at the Home and the School. In addition to this, they administer vaccination such as TT and medication for de-worming regularly. We also thank the Health Inspector for arranging to carry out the anti-mosquito fogging in the campus.

## **1-09** Counseling Sessions and Medical Camps

We thank Dr. Selva Titus, Dean, College of Nursing and Mrs. Rajeshwari Siva, Head of Community Health Nursing department for sending their faculty and students to conduct periodical health screening for the children at the Home and the school. We also thank the team for giving health talks and counselling to the adolescent children as part of their health screening. Also, we thank Dr. Suseela Russel and the doctors in the of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry unit of MHC, Bagayam for their valuable support in assessing and treating children with various Psychiatric issues.

# 1-10 Make A Difference (MAD)

Make a Difference is a youth-driven, non-profit organization working to ensure better outcomes for children in orphanages and street shelters. MAD's vision is that even the most vulnerable children in society are able to realize equitable outcomes. Enthusiastic engineering students from Vellore Institute of Technology University who are MAD volunteers visit MBKG Pannai on the weekends to help our children. They tutor them in Science and Mathematics. They conduct a 3-day outbound experiential camp called the **Dream Camp** that help children to achieve their dreams through personal discovery, exploring new talents by challenging themselves & taking responsibility of their action/decisions. We thank the MAD volunteers for investing their time and effort in our children.

# 1-11 Obituary

Elders, Mr. Dayawathi Wilson, 79 and Mrs. Lakshmi Subramani, 74 passed away in January and February 2019 respectively. Their funeral service was held at the Home campus and the burial was done at the cemetery of CSI Kasam church.

### **02** Sponsorship Program

"It is more blessed to give than to receive" is the experience of the good-willed people in the sponsorship program. Regular updates on the children and the happenings at the Home are the key to the success of the program. In addition to this, the salary deduction facility has made it more convenient for the sponsors and regular donors from CMC Hospital to continue their support.

When sponsors express their desire to support a child, a welcome pack with a brief history of the organization, background information about the child (a case history), a recent full-size photograph and a handwritten letter or a colouring page of the child is sent to them. Regular updates of the children are sent to the sponsor with the quarterly newsletter. In addition to this, an e-mail contact list of the sponsors is being maintained to make the correspondence quick and cost-effective. During special occasions and festive times, sponsors who have email IDs are sent video clips of the children singing or reciting a rhyme which makes them very happy.

In April 2018, the Sponsorship Coordinator, Mrs. Anita G. Paul was invited by the Global Ministries to the USA for a month to attend its board meeting and meet sponsors. She travelled to 7 states meeting individuals and churches sponsoring children and elders and sharing how their support transform lives of hundreds of destitute children and elders at the Home and day students at King's school. She was well received and the trip was a successful one for the organization.

In addition to the regular child sponsorship programme, people join us in celebrating their special occasions such as birthdays wedding anniversaries, thanksgiving and memorial days by sponsoring special meals / snacks to the children and elders. There is a tariff for the meals. In the

recent times, number people sponsoring meals has gradually increased which has reduced the food expenses considerably.

## **Charities Aid Foundation (CAF) LONDON, UK**

After a very thorough 'Due diligence' study and report we are for the last many years a REGISTERED CHARITY for UK donors. This registration allows all donors from UK to route their funds through the CAF, UK. The advantage of routing funds through the CAF UK is that the CAF adds on the tax rebate given on the donation and sends it to us.

# Gift A Smile

Charities Aid Foundation (CAF) India is a registered public charitable trust, a part of CAF International network, whose mission is to promote and support strategic giving for a more equitable and sustainable society. CAF Partners with one of its clients, Amazon India, to help NGOs such as ours through a programme called 'Gift a Smile'. This is an in-kind donation program which let NGOs create their own wish list of products (books for children, sports equipment, puzzles, etc. and medical equipment like health monitors & mobility aids and a host of other products available on Amazon website) that are needed. This wish list is then displayed on Amazon's landing page and is visible to any person who visits the website and intends to fulfill a particular wish of the NGO.

### 03 Bakery

The bakery unit was started initially as a training program for the boys who dropped out of school. In recent times, we have none of the boys who dropped out of the schooling system. The unit continues to run solely to meet the needs of the home and a few regular consumers. 22% of the bakery products are consumed by the home. The unit continues to run at a low profit which is less than the previous year.

# **04 Tailoring Training Center**

The garment making unit was started to train the girls who dropped out of school. As we have NO girls dropping out of the school system the unit continues to run to meet the needs of the home and few regular customers like the CMC Hospital. The unit provides tailoring training to poor girls from the surrounding villages and also caters to 50% of the stitching requirements of the home.

#### **05 King's School**

King's Matriculation Higher Secondary School caters to the educational needs of the children from the Home as well children from the surrounding Villages. It continues to provide quality education at an affordable cost. The strength for the academic year 2018 – 2019 was 762.

#### 5-01 Academic Excellence

In the 2019 Board Examinations, the students have fared well. In the 8<sup>th</sup> batch of 12th grade, out of 43 students 36 passed with 84 percent result. The class topper in 12th grade was Vinodhini. L with a score of 427 out of 600. In 10th grade, out of 58 students 57 passed with 98 percent result. In 10th grade, the class topper was Naveenkumar G.S who secured 453 out of 500.

### **Teaching Faculty**

### 5-03 Teachers' Enrichment program

A work shop was organized by Ratna Sagar, the book publishers and conducted by Dr. John Love Joy, Prof. & Head of the Dept. English, St. Joseph's college to enrich the knowledge of teachers. He focused on incorporating listening skills, speaking skills and class room management. The teachers used this opportunity to brush up their skills. They got the chance to discuss, understand and internalize the practical problems related to English language teaching. It was an amazing learning and awareness raising experience.

### 5-04 Workshop on ASD for Teachers

Department of Development Pediatrics, CMC & Hospital, Vellore organized a workshop on Autism spectrum disorder for school teachers on 13<sup>th</sup> April 2019. Four teachers from the school attended the programme. School based intervention, practical challenges and solutions were addressed in the workshop.

## 5-05 Max X-Seed Education

King's school has introduced a new digital learning program Max X-Seed for classes 6 to 8. X-Seed is a research – based academic program for schools that build thinking skills and problem solving confidence in children. With MAX, every child can learn and love Mathematics & Science. In Max X-Seed classes children watch digital content but actively engage with it, reflecting and receiving assessment feedback.

## 5-06 Holistic Development of children at the Kindergarten level

"Education is the process of living and is not meant to be the preparation of future living". Holistic education is being followed at the kindergarten school. An interactive session on "Holistic development of children" was organized by the Jeewandeep publications for the kindergarten teachers. Mrs. Esther Varghese, the resource person highlighted the importance of children's physical, social, cognitive, creative and emotional skills. It helps the child to develop the nurture of 21<sup>st</sup> century skills like active learning, out of box thinking, critical thinking and efficiency learning.

### 5-07 Value Education
