The greatest leader I had ever known was my mother, Janice Work, who had a huge impact on my life and on the lives of countless others. As a teacher and later an administrator, she made manycrucial improvements in education for our community. Also as a mother, she was a wonderful role model for me and my two younger siblings while we were growing up. She also possessed immense personal strength, which was apparent during her battle with cancer. She was a strong, influential leader from whom I learned an incredible amount.

In November 2005, my mother was diagnosed with a rare cancer of the bile ducts of liver. For the next four months, she fought the disease with everything she had, but in March she passed away. During her illness, she was incredibly brave. Her resilience continually astounded me; I remember her helping my 11 year old brother with his home work with an oxygen tube in her nose.

She was always thinking of her family and our well being. Even from the hospital bed she was our leader, giving us comfort and strength. We were not the only ones whose lives she touched; she was a true leader in the community. I have always aspired to emulate her compassion and strength. Throughout her life, my mother, Janice Work, was a leader in her community and family, demonstrating kindness, strength and bravery even during illness. She changed the lives of countless people for the better, inspiring me to cultivate within myself similar characteristics, so that I, too, may be as a great
