#### The Pannai Playroom

Eve Kirby's visit to Pannai saw the inauguration of a playroom for two and three year olds. After returning to the U.K. she sent us a report detailing many of the room's innovations and learning aids. "I went with ideas to paint the walls of the playroom and sew some toys so that the children could enjoy being in their room with stimulus from these." The painters, under direction from Mr. Daniels and Eve Kirby, painted an alphabet chart, as well as a train at children's height "so that the children can pretend that they are sitting in the carriages." They painted a small basin "where the children can mime washing their hands and brushing their teeth," as well as

triangles, squares, Tamil vowels and numbers (from 0-9). Perhaps the most novel of the room's innovations is a painted set of footprints in blue, and another in red, "for the children to follow [and] develop...a sense of balance" Thank you for your support Eve Kirby, the playroom will bring joy to many children over many years.

#### Children's Annual Camp

The 2010 annual camp was held at Trans World Radio - India. It was very close to the sea, and free from noise and air pollution. The beautiful venue, and the wonderful food our hosts gave us, left us with the impression we had arrived in the Promised Land. The children enjoyed boating and playing at the sea shore. A children's ministry, J Team, were our leaders throughout the camp and did a good job of encouraging the children. We all enjoyed dancing, singing, studying the bible and learning new games together. We learned that God has given us talents; we must practice and use them toward Godly ends. In April Dr Margaret Brearley and her husband Stephen visited King's School. Their excitement and enthusiasm for the school's work has inspired their son Sam to come and volunteer with us for a month.

At the time of writing, we are being visited by Sam Brearley, the brother of Josh (to whom our library is dedicated). He is teaching history to our Year 9's as well as English conversation to years 8, 9 and 10. He says he has found the challenge of relaying complex ideas to a class whose English is their second language incredibly enjoyable and rewarding. He is also helping out in the home, and has just sponsored one of our youngest home children!









#### Sam's First Impressions

I was asked to write a few words about my first impressions of MBKGP, and my mind immediately hit upon Charles Dickens. The backgrounds of many children here could have sprung from the pages of an Indian Oliver Twist. Yet at MBKGP, poverty is not met with apathy, but with action and education, love and support.
