Seeing with My Own Eyes

At 4 am on Friday, October 24th I am on an overnight train traveling across India. From my lower berth I peer out into the inky dark night. Sleep eludes me. The thought of missing my scheduled 4:30am stop at Katpadi has me in a panic.

Train station stops in India come unannounced.

Every time we slowed, I wondered, "Is this where I get off?"

I look out onto the dimly lit station platforms. I see shadows, then human beings, whole families asleep on cardboard. "Maybe I don't want to get off this train" I thought to myself.

Yet stronger than my fear was my determination: I wanted to see Saranya, our sponsored child.

Ten years ago, Ms. Linda Lawrence, Director of Global Ministries' Child Sponsorship Program through Family Village Farm paired our family with one of its residents, a young girl by the name of Saranya.

Over those past ten years, my wife and two sons have corresponded with Saranya, celebrating her accomplishments in school, and posting a photograph of her on our refrigerator door. Never did I imagine I would see her with my own eyes.

At last, the Chennai express pulls into the Katpadi station. Justice, the driver employed by FVF, is there to greet me. As we make the short drive from Katpadi to Kasam, I am riveted to the window. I see women in line with buckets waiting to fill up with water at the community tap, gypsies living in flimsy tents soaked by the monsoon rains, and cow powered carts hauling rice.

Upon my arrival at MBKG Pannai, I am escorted to a simple but lovely guest room. I promptly fall asleep. A few hours later, I awake to the sounds of chattering crows, barking dogs and the cheerful sounds of children.

No sooner had I made my way to the dining hall, but children came up to me and said, "Here's Saranya now! Aren't you her sponsor?"

My first impression? Even though this was the first time I laid eyes upon her, I felt as if she was my long lost daughter. How does one convey in words the feeling of connection, of bonds, transcending so many miles, such different worlds?

Throughout that morning and for the next two days, she became my host. She spoke excellent English. I learned that she loves to sing. She brought me a cup of coffee and we sat down together on a cement stoop.

Later that day I gave her a watch that my wife Linda had purchased back in the States. That evening, I sat with her in her cottage where I helped lead devotions. I taught the children, "They will know we are Christians by our love". All of the 170 children of the FVF live in there. Women who themselves are destitute or widowed, take on

the role of "mothers" for these children.

As I sat on the bare floor of an unadorned room singing spiritual songs I noticed the bible quote hanging on the wall.

"In as much as you have done to the least of these you have done unto me" Never did Jesus' words feel more relevant than this moment with these children. The love in the FVF community made these words come to life.

The next day, Saranya took me by the hand and gave me a personal tour of the orphanage. She asked about my sons, saying, "Someday I want to meet my brothers, Christopher and Daniel"

When she reached out for my hand, she reached into my heart.

It was all I could do on Saturday morning, to say good bye. "Are you leaving now?" she asked.

"Yes" I said, "But I will write. Promise me you will study for your exams. I won't forget you".

This is a promise I will keep, I tell myself.

How often, I think, we feel overwhelmed with the world's suffering. But here in reaching out to one child we can make a difference.

I keep thinking about that moment when Saranya reached for my hand. Join me and sponsor a child at the Family Village Farm. - Rev. Dr. Peter A. Luckey


Many more needy students have been identified for our lunch program at the School. We remain grateful to all the sponsors, donors and well wishers who have made this program possible and are sustaining it.





