Your prayers have brought us so many blessings and it gives us great pleasure to share with you all the happenings at the home and school through this news letter.

Visitors:

The visits of Volunteers and Sponsors bring us great joy as we share our ministry with them. The time spent by them with us is greatly appreciated and valued as they bring so much joy and happiness into the lives of our children with their many skills and talents We look forward to having more of you to visit us and share in our ministry

We now look forward with great excitement to welcome to our midst the Clyde Work family (5 grand children!!!)

We thank Rev. Augustin of the C.S.I. Vellore Diocese for having brought the theological students from the U.S. as part of their exposure programme. We were very happy to have Charlie Smith and Jenila Smith with us soon after their marriage. They dropped in to see their sponsored child and to treat us all to a sumptuous dinner. "Thank. You" Charlie and Jenila "Our Best wishes to both of you for a very Happy Married life" We were happy to have David another sponsor with us for a couple of days. He was very happy to see his sponsored child and old friends here. It was a very joyous moment for us to have Rev. Herb and his great grand niece Jessie and Grand nephew Mathew to visit us. In the midst of their busy schedule they made it a point to see the sponsored children of their church and spend some time with them.

We are very happy to have with us Marie White from the U.K., Marie is the sister of Mr.John Field an old good friend of the MBKGP. Marie is a retired teacher, librarian. Counselor and a sportswoman. It was a joy and blessing to have Marie with us sharing her love and talents with us.

Home:

Admission: We have admitted eight new children in the Nursery during this period; altogether we have admitted twenty two children in the nursery this year

At present we have 186 residents at the Pannai comprising of 164 children 11 mothers and 11 aged grandparents. 34 of our children are staying in various hostels to pursue their higher education or professional courses.

Discharge: We have discharged David Raja who has completed his technical training at Tindivanam and is working in Coimbatore.

Mothers: We have appointed two new mothers for the nursery. We still need two more for the nursery and three more for the cottages. Please pray for this urgent need

Community Health Worker: We have appointed a Community health worker to give health care to all at the MBKGP.

Warden: Our nursery warden, Mrs. Premavathy Raja met with an accident and had a crack on her hip bone and is under treatment. Please pray for her quick and total recovery.

Retreat: During the quarterly holidays some of our boys attended the youth retreat at VRV Girls' Higher Secondary School. Some of our girls attended the youth retreat at CSI Central Church, Vellore.

Lamp Lighting Ceremony: Rajeshwari is doing her 1st year diploma nursing at Oddanchatram. Mrs. Prema, our nursery warden attended her lamp lighting ceremony in September.

Gifts from VIT students: We are thankful to the final year Vellore Institute of Technology students who gave lunch and note books, pens and some play things to Pannai children before their final exams.

Educational Performance: Sudha and Kasthuri who are doing secretarial course at Coimbatore stand first and third in their respective classes. Sathish Kumar has completed his B.Pharmacy course and is working as a lecturer in a Pharmacy College at Bangalore. Soon he will be joining his Masters course in Pharmacy.

We are happy that three of our boys who have joined professional courses have given a part of their earning to support their brothers and sisters at Pannai.

Our children have finished their Quarterly exam and II Mid-Term test. After analyzing their performance we are planning to give special coaching to the slow learners.

Activities during Quarterly Holidays: Children had different activities during Quarterly Holidays, such as study hours, conversation time, reading time, campus cleaning, kitchen cleaning, cottage cleaning and book binding. Memory verse competition and Bible quiz were conducted and prizes were given. On October 2nd which was Mahatma Gandhiji's Birthday we distributed chocolates to the children. Basket Ball, Volley Ball and Throw Ball matches were conducted for boys and girls. Mr. & Mrs. Walter our chief guests distributed the gifts for the winners. Children were taken for an outing to a small dam called "Raja Thowppu".

Children were shown video shows during their free hours.

Deepawali is a festival of lights, celebrated in India. New dresses were given to our children. They burnt crackers and had a talent evening where they sang some songs and danced. They had special eatables and briyani prepared by the mothers and cooks.

During the harvest festival of our local church our home child Latha got prize in the memory verse competition.

News from the Units:

Garment Making Unit: We are thankful to Christian Medical College Hospital, Vellore for their increased orders which keeps us busy at the Garment Units. It helps to improve their efficiency too

Bakery: We continue to make bread, buns, biscuits, cakes and puffs for sale. There is a great demand for almost all the products of this unit and we are making some profit. If we could promote the bakery sale further, and control it carefully, we can earn better. Our hostel boys are interested in this work, and spend their free time in the bakery and learning baking skills.

Feed Mixing Unit: We are producing eight to ten tons of Cattle feed every month for the use in our dairy. The excess of four to five tons is sold to local farmers.

Dairy: Our Dairy is progressing and moving forward step by step. We hope that by June 2005 the Diary would become profitable. Milk yield also has increased considerably. After covering the requirements of the home we are selling out the surplus milk through the Hatsun Chilling Center. We are expecting 6 animals to calve between January 2005 and May 2005s. We are fully concentrating to develop our heifers to improve our milk production. We hope to have three to four heifers by June 2005. We have worked out that if we have 20 milking animals, at all times we can run the dairy profitably. So, instead of buying new cows we hope to develop our own good heifer stock.

King's Matriculation School:

Examination: Our children have finished their Quarterly examination and had their holidays. The kitchen garden and the Botanical gardens are maintained well, which add to the beauty of the campus.

Teachers' Day: September 5th, our late President Dr. RadaKrishnan's Birth day is observed as Teachers' Day. The little Kids of the primary section greeted their teachers with flowers Their songs and dances made them feel that they are loved and cared for by the children. Video shows were arranged for senior section students.

Computer Classes: Computer classes are conducted regularly. During Quarterly Holidays VIII, IX and X standard students had computer classes. Report cards have been issued – Feedback – II Mid-Term tests were conducted in November.

Children's Day: November 14th, the Birth day of our late Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru is celebrated as children's Day. A nice tea was given to all the King's Matriculation School students. The staff of King's Matriculation School entertained the children with their speech, poem, songs and dances.

Prayer Concerns:

Furniture for Dining Hall: We are building a common dining hall at the home for the residents and need nearly Rupees. 1.75000 Or approximately USD 4000 towards equipping and furnishing the dining hall with Table and Chairs

Scholarship endowment fund for King's Matriculation School children:

The majority of the day students who attend the King's School are from very poor families. Their parents are mostly laborers and many are illiterate and unemployed. The continued drought in this part of India has caused widespread poverty. We are looking into ways of supporting these children. By giving them scholarships and subsidizing the

cost of their education

We thank the Global Ministries for the first very generous contribution we received towards the Scholarship endowment fund. We also thank the many individual donors who have contributed this year in providing scholarship for over 100 children

The need for growing the scholarship endowment fund continues and we would gratefully accept any donations to help this fund grow. To sponsor a child's education at the Kings School costs an average of USD \$ 130 per year

White washing and painting of the cottages: We need nearly Rupees 1, 25,000 or approximately USD 2750 towards the white washing and painting of the cottages, which

is due after a period of four years

More sponsorship for children We continue to get requests for fresh admissions from deserving children and guardians. We consider each application for admission prayerfully and give admission when ever possible. At present there are 48 children in our Nursery and we do not even have sufficient number of Mothers to look after these children. We are however sure that God in His mercies will provide us our needs. We are always thankful to the Global Ministries for the new sponsors that they find for us from time to time We continue to pray for this very urgent need to find more sponsors for the children we have admitted, and for the many more who are waiting to join the family. Please do keep this urgent need in your prayers

Grand Parents and house mothers Sponsorship: At present there is no financial provision for the elderly residents of Pannai (the grand parents) and the housemothers who are destitute women who help in looking after the children and grandparents. As mentioned in the last News Letter, we would like to start a grandparent and house mother sponsorship programme. Sponsoring a grandparent or a house mother for a month would cost US\$ 30.

Endowment fund for Higher Education:

On the sponsored children reaching 18 years of age they are moved out/aged out of the Sponsorship programme.(i.e. their sponsorship ceases)

However we continue to support these children through their higher education or professional courses. We have a major crisis in this situation as these children do NOT get any sponsorship money and we are burdened with funding their higher/professional education which is turning out to be very expensive. We are in urgent need of funds to support them. We would like to build up an endowment fund for the higher education for un-sponsored children at Pannai. We seek your prayers and support to build this endowment

Request for Computers: We received money to purchase four computers from the Clyde Work family and Lynette Pickering. We are very grateful to these our friends for their generous gifts. We need to furnish the new computer laboratory as we are very keen to give the children in the school an opportunity to learn Computer skills and make them Computer literate with hands on experience in using the computer. We have NO funds to buy the computers and are looking for DONORS to equip the computer laboratory. The Cost of one computer would be approximately USD 650. Please do keep our requirements in your prayers and help us if you can
