DIRECTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT 2021 - 2022

First and the foremost, I thank God for having given me the opportunity to serve this great institution and thank Him for guiding and leading me through the many crisis situations, challenging times and the good times. Also, during the unprecedented COVID -19 Pandemic, the residents were kept healthy and safe by God's grace and mercy.

With God's abundant grace and mercy and with the active support of our sponsors, hard work of our staff and with the guidance of the board we were able to meet all our commitments and needs.

I would like to place on record our heartfelt gratitude to all our sponsors and well-wishers, the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and the board members. It is your counsel, generous support and prayers that has enabled us to successfully continue and abide by the vision and mission of our founder Dr. Miss. Pauline E. King.

I would like to begin my report by personally acknowledging and thanking our principal sponsors the Global Ministries, USA, St. John's Church, Alresford, UK, Friends of Kasam, UK, Individual sponsors and donors local as well as abroad and our many friends from the CMC Hospital and the Vellore community for their generous support in cash and kind.

1-00 HOME:

We are glad to report that we are making continuous efforts to improve the quality of life of our children and grandparents. Our house mothers are daily motivated and encouraged to render good care for the children and the elders. Our grandparents maintain good health with regular medication and periodic check-ups. As our grandparents are aging fast the responsibility of taking care of them is becoming a big challenge. We are striving hard to provide quality care for each of them.

The organization has under its care 168 children from the ages of 2 years to 21 years, 9 House Mothers, and 16 Grandmothers living together in 8 cottages, a nursery, and a boys' hostel.

I place on record my appreciation for the tireless work of the wardens and the House Mothers that took care of the children and the elders during the lockdown period.

1-01 A Special COVID-19 Report:

In the ongoing COVID-19 Pandemic, due to the sudden surge in the COVID-19 cases in the country, from May 9, 2021 onwards the government of Tamil Nadu announced complete lockdown. The district of Vellore too witnessed a massive spike in COVID-19 cases during the second wave of the pandemic. In spite of the panic and the chaos outside the walls of the MBKG Pannai (FVF) Home, the residents felt safe and calm inside the campus. Our primary concern, at that point was for the health and the wellbeing of the Children, House Mothers and Grandmothers we serve. We continued to monitor the situation around COVID-19 including



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guidelines from the state government as well as the local government authorities and diligently followed the standard operating procedures.

Children with flu like symptoms were isolated and prophylactic measures were implemented. Swab test for COVID-19 was performed on all residents which fortunately turned out be negative for all of them. 45 residents were vaccinated against COVID-19 that included children above the age of 18, House Mothers and Grandmothers. The residents were blessed to have uninterrupted supply of food, medicines and other basic needs during the lockdown. The administration office was closed for almost two months in the months of May and June 2021. Nevertheless, the essential staff were available to meet the needs of the residents.

With the Corona virus cases dropping in the district of Vellore, the State government announced a slew of relaxations against the ongoing lockdown beginning July 1, 2021. The admin office resumed full function from July 1, 2021.

Though schools are still closed, the children of the Home have daily class room learning from 10 AM to 12 Noon with the help of study materials from the school. The teaching faculty from King's school assist the home children with their learning. While some of the older children studying in colleges attend online classes, many others have gone back to their residential colleges. We could say in our experience that the COVID-19 pandemic has brought out the best in many of our friends and partners who showed compassion and empathy and offered their helping hand during these extraordinary times.

We take this opportunity to thank all of them for their continued support and prayers. Many generous people sponsored special meals for the residents even during the lockdown. We would never have been able to transition smoothly through the hard times without your support. ***We are overwhelmed with gratitude to all of you, kind-hearted people that love the MBKG Pannai (FVF) Home!***

- No. of Home children studying from LKG to 12th grade at King's Matriculation Higher Secondary School was 120.
- This academic year 7 of our home children appeared for the 12th grade board examination and only 3 got through successfully with good marks.
- This academic year, in 10th grade, out of the 7 children from the Home, 6 were promoted to 11th grade and one boy joined Industrial Training Institute.
- **Admission and Discharges:** In the year 2021 – 2022, we admitted 2 children and 2 grandmothers.
- **Deaths:** Two Elders, Mrs. Parvathy (85) and Mrs. Kousalya (80) passed away in October 2021 and November 2021 respectively.

1-03 Higher Education:

After completing 12th grade, our children are enrolled in professional and Vocational training courses depending on their academic performances and interests.

When our children reach the age of 18, they cease to receive sponsorship money but we continue to support their higher education which includes professional, vocational, or technical courses. We are in a difficult situation here as these courses are very expensive. For this reason, we have created a **Scholarship Endowment Fund for Higher Education** to help us meet these expenses. We thank the donors and sponsors who have helped us to meet our higher educational expenses and we earnestly seek your prayers and support in building up this fund.

We have done our best to ensure that every child has some Professional / Vocational training to meet the challenges of facing life outside the Institution after their discharge from the Home. This is a dramatic change that has taken place in the last 20 years. I would like to place on record the remarkable scholarship support we get from the College of Nursing at CMC for the training of our children since 2002. I wish to thank the Dean Dr. Mrs. Vathsala Sadan and every member of our society from the nursing college for this great support.

1-05 Chapel of Joy:



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In August 2021, a small chapel named “*Joy Chapel*” was dedicated to the glory of God by the chairman, Rt. Rev. Dr. H. Sharma Nithyanandham at the heart of MBKG Pannai Home. The chapel is used by the residents for a quiet time and the elders will use it for their daily devotion. MBKG Pannai family thanks Rev. Donald Asman, Mrs. Judith Asman, and the United Church of Christ, Judd Street, Hawaii, the USA for funding the project.

1-06 Staff Retreat:

In January 2022, as in practice a staff retreat was held in the beginning of the year for the staff of the Home as well as King’s school. This year, Mr. T.S. Ravikumar, retired Professor of Emergency Nursing department, CMCH was the speaker. The staff rededicated themselves for mission and were spiritually enriched with the word of God. The secretary Dr. Samuel. N.J. David also joined the retreat and encouraged the staff to work with commitment for betterment of the children.

2-00 Integrated Complex:

MBKG Pannai continues to be the best ‘**Integrated Complex of Special Homes for Senior Citizens and Destitute Children**’ in Vellore District. There are periodical visits carried out by the District Social Welfare officer to inspect the place, residents, and records. It stands to the credit of the staff for their great effort in maintaining the required standards and documentation for this award given to the MBKG Pannai for the 11th year in a row. Every year, we receive grant in aid from the Director of Social Welfare, Chennai. For the year 2021 – 2022, we received Rs. 12, 17, 100/-.

After Care Support: This new scheme was initiated by the Department of Social Defense for the support of Higher Education of the children from Child Care Institutes such as ours. Children above 18 years of age studying in professional courses received educational support from the Director of Social Defense, Chennai after validation. For the year 2021 – 2022, we received Rs. 2, 64, 000/- for 6 children.

2-01 Visits of Government Officials:

The District Social Welfare Officer (DSWO), the District Child Protection Officer (DCPO) and the Chairman, District Child Welfare Committee (CWC) and members visit the Home periodically to inspect the facility, interact with the residents, check the Records and Registers, and also to inspect the overall maintenance of the Home.

In July 2021, Mr. K. Durairaj, Member, State Commission for Protection of Child Rights Government of Tamil Nadu visited the Home. He inspected the Nursery, Cottages, Kitchen, Dining hall, and central store. Also, he interacted with the residents.



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In September 2021, the District Level Inspection Committee (DLIC) Team comprising of District Child Protection Officer (DCPO), Chairman or a member of the Child Welfare Committee, representatives of Health, Revenue and a team member of Child Line visited the Home for Inspection and certified that the children were healthy and safe in the Home.

In October 2021, the Chairman and members of the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) visited the Home to certify that RT-PCR Tests for COVID-19 followed by COVID-19 vaccination were administered to the older children and adults including the staff, that the Individual Care Plan (ICP) for all the children are complete and that the Standard Operation Procedures (SOP) for COVID -19 are implemented in the home campus.

In December 2021, The District Level Inspection Committee (DLIC) team visited the Home for inspection. The team advised to form Children's Committee, Home Management Committee, and to conduct periodical meetings with the children and update the Individual Care Plan (ICP).

In February 2022, Mrs. Uma Maheshwari, the District Child Protection Officer visited the Home and checked the mandatory registers such as Admission and Discharge Registers, Attendance Registers for Staff and Children, Case File of each Child, Status of the CCTV Cameras, Meals Register / Nutrition Diet File, General Medical Records of the children, Items Issue Registers, the Female Menstrual Cycle Register and Central Store Stock Register. The officer commended the staff for the updated registers.

3-00 Christmas Celebration December 2021:

After missing the Christmas celebration in 2020 due to COVID -19 Pandemic, the Children, House Mothers, and Grandmothers were greatly delighted to celebrate the birth of Christ on the evening of 25th December 2021. Mrs. Kalaimani Thiyagarajan, a retired Headmistress and wife of Rev. Dr. Thiyagarajan, was the chief guest who delivered the Christmas message.

The children glorified the Lord through dances, carols and skit. The programme ended with prayer and benediction by Rev. Dr. Thiyagarajan. Christmas feast sponsored by Dr. Chakko Jacob family, Bangalore, Mr. Retbin Rajeev family, Bangalore and Dr. George Philip's family, Vellore. It was a perfect time for the residents to celebrate the love of God and create lasting memories. It was indeed a joyous and meaningful occasion for them.

3-01 Visit of Nurses League, College of Nursing, CMCH:

Nurses from the College of Nursing, Christian Medical College Hospital representing the Nurses League, and LOCAL UNIT visit the Home every year before Christmas to meet the children. In December 2021, a team of members visited the Home and entertained the children



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with a Christmas story and taught them an action song. The Local Unit of the Nurses League sponsors a child.

3-02 Christmas Cheer Fund – CMCH:

MBKG Pannai thanks the Management and Employees of Christian Medical College Hospital for their annual donation of Christmas dresses to the Children, House Mothers, and Elders from their Employees' *Christmas Cheer Fund*. In December 2021, the hospital was represented by staff of Accounts Department that visited the Home and distributed the dresses to the residents.

3-03 Christmas Gifts from People's Church, Ireland:

Every Year for Christmas, Pastor Patrick Fitzgerald of People's Church in Dublin, Ireland with his family and the Overseas Mission Team of his church visits the Home and donates individually packed Christmas gifts to the children, House Mothers, and Elders. In December 2021, due to Corona Virus Pandemic, the team could not visit the Home. Nonetheless, they were thoughtful in sending gifts to everyone at MBKG Pannai Home for Christmas. We are overwhelmed with gratitude and thank Pastor Patrick and his church for keeping up their kind gesture even during difficult times.

3-04 Alumni Reunion:

On January 20, 2022, the Alumni and the present children along with the staff, House mothers, and Grandmothers celebrated the life of Dr. Miss. Pauline E. King, whom they fondly called 'Mummy'. It was her 22nd death anniversary. A small thanksgiving meeting was held to thank the Lord for the great life of the legend. The alumni and the present residents paid tribute to her by placing garlands and lighting candles on her resting place. The alumni reminisced on the blessings of knowing her in person and talked about her sacrifices for their betterment.

4-00 Health and Nutrition:

The children, mothers and grandparents continue to be in good health. Routine medical check-up for the grandparents is done at S.I.H – R & L.C, Hospital, Karigiri, Government Primary Health Center, Serkadu and the Government Hospital, Thiruvalem. We follow a scheduled well balanced food menu, a daily multivitamin tablet, and a fruit three times a week for the children, mothers, and grandparents. Once in 6 months de-worming and, quarterly weight and height checks are being done to monitor children's growth.

The PHC gives us a monthly supply of Sanitary Napkins for the girls and Deworming tablets as well as over the counter medicines such as Paracetamol and Vitamin Supplements. In addition to this, we send our grandmothers for a routine check-up once in three months and they are supplied with the required medicines.



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We thank the government Primary Health Centre and the Hospital for its support in maintaining the health of the Children and elders. Also, we thank the Health Inspector for arranging to carry out the anti-mosquito fogging in the campus.

4-01 Doorstep Health Care Scheme (Makkalai Thedi Maruthuvam):

In August 2021, the Tamil Nadu Government launched a scheme called Doorstep Health Care Scheme (*Makkalai Thedi Maruthuvam*) for medical screening of people above 45 years of age and others with infirmities through routine Check-ups. MBKG Pannai is enrolled under this scheme. In March 2022, the medical Team from Thiruvalem Government Hospital conducted a health screening for the Housemothers and Grandmothers and gave medications. The team will conduct such screening camps at MBKG Pannai quarterly.

4-02 Health Camp by Community Health Nursing Department, CMCH:

In October 2021, a team of Community Health Nurses under the leadership of Mrs. Rajeshwari Siva, Head of Community Health Nursing Department, College of Nursing, CMC conducted a general health checkup for the Kings' school children in the morning and in the afternoon for the elders, housemothers, and staff of the MBKG Pannai Home. In the school, the team conducted an awareness programme about the COVID-19 Pandemic with a video presentation. Also, students' and teachers' general health was assessed and Vitamin supplements were administered. At the Home, the Nursing team checked Blood Pressure, Blood Sugar, and Hemoglobin for the elders, housemothers, and the staff. The management thanks Mrs. Rajeshwari Siva and her team for conducting such a general health camp every year for the children in the school as well as Home.

4-03 TB Awareness programme:

In January 2022, A Tuberculosis awareness programme was conducted by the Vellore district team of the National Tuberculosis Elimination Programme headed by Dr. Jayasree, Deputy Director of Medical Services, Vellore TB Control Programme.

The team consisting of District Health Educators educated the residents about the signs and symptoms and treatment of the disease with the help of PowerPoint presentation and Video. Also, the team created awareness about the facilities available at the Government Health Centres.

4-04 Menstrual Hygiene Awareness Programme:

In March 2022, The Vellore Tangent Club conducted an awareness programme on Menstrual Hygiene for the older girls and Housemothers. The programme was organized by Mr. Saravana Prasad, 41 Clubs National Past Secretary and Mrs. Nalini Prasad, the Tangent Club National



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Secretary. The 41 Club Chairman and a member was present for the programme. Awareness on importance of Menstrual Hygiene was created among young girls and women with a speech and video presentation. The club donated sanitary Napkins for the participants.

5-00 Sponsorship Program:

“It is more blessed to give than to receive” is the experience of the good-willed people in the sponsorship program. Regular updates on the children and the happenings at the Home are the key to the success of the program. In addition to this, the salary deduction facility has made it more convenient for the sponsors and regular donors from CMC Hospital to continue their support.

When sponsors express their desire to support a child, a welcome pack with a brief history of the organization, background information about the child (a case history), a recent full-size photograph, and a handwritten letter or a colouring page of the child is sent to them. Regular updates of the children are sent to the sponsor with the quarterly newsletter. In addition to this, an e-mail contact list of the sponsors is being maintained to make the correspondence quick and cost-effective. During special occasions and festive times, sponsors who have email IDs are sent video clips of the children singing or reciting a rhyme that makes them very happy.

In addition to the regular child sponsorship programme, people join us in celebrating their special occasions such as birthdays, wedding anniversaries, thanksgiving, and memorial days by sponsoring special meals/snacks for the children and elders. There is a tariff for the meals. In recent times, the number of people sponsoring meals has increased which has reduced food expenses considerably.

5-02 Friends of Kasam, UK:

Friends of Kasam, UK was formed by Mr. John Ramsbottom and Mrs. Marie white, a couple from the United Kingdom who were associated with MBKG Pannai since 2003. Since then,



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the couple visits the home at the beginning of the year annually. They are closely involved in the development of the Home and their contribution has been colossal. Besides their personal sponsorship of 4 children, they have introduced 20 new sponsors who sponsor 35 children. In addition to the Child Sponsorship, their friends donate a substantial amount of money towards special projects as well for general purposes. The couple also, being aware of the need for developing sports skills of the children, has created a special Sports fund through which we purchase sports equipment and pay incentive for Mr. Vijayakumar, our accounts assistant for coaching the children interested in Basketball. The outcome is reflected in the general take-up of these activities and the representation of Kasam children in Vellore District team selections.

The money contributed by Friends of Kasam UK has reached a significant amount in 2021-2022.

Their contribution was 20% in overall inward remittance for this period. We are always grateful to Mr. John Ramsbottom and Mrs. Marie White for their partnership and huge contribution.

5-03 Retirement Ms. Linda Lawrence, Global Ministries, USA:

Ms. Linda Lawrence, the Child, and Elder Sponsorship Program Manager retired in November 2021 after serving in Global Ministries for many decades. She visited the MBKG Pannai in 2001 for the first time followed by 2007 and 2019. In February 2019, she attended the Golden Jubilee celebrations as a representative of Global Ministries. During her service as the Child and Elder Sponsorship Program Manager, her most remarkable contribution was initiating the *Day Student Support Programme at King's school*. She along with the Southern Asia Area executives routed donations for major projects such as school buses, the Janice Work Memorial Dining Hall, a new wing in the school campus, and so on. She was truly an advocate for the good cause of MBKG Pannai mission. The organization is grateful to her for her enormous contribution and wishes her a happy retirement life.

5-04 Charities Aid Foundation (CAF) London, UK:

After a very thorough 'Due diligence' study and report we are for the last many years a REGISTERED CHARITY for UK donors. This registration allows all donors from the UK to route their funds through the CAF, UK. The advantage of routing funds through the CAF UK is that the CAF adds on the tax rebate given on the donation and sends it to us.

5-05 Amazon - Gift A Smile:

Charities Aid Foundation (CAF) India is a registered public charitable trust, a part of CAF International network, whose mission is to promote and support strategic giving for a more equitable and sustainable society. CAF Partners with one of its clients, Amazon India, to help NGOs such as ours through a programme called '**Gift a Smile**'. This is an in-kind donation program that let NGOs create their own wish list of products (books for children,



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sports equipment, puzzles, etc. and medical equipment like health monitors & mobility aids and a host of other products available on Amazon website) that are needed. This wish list is then displayed on Amazon's landing page and is visible to any person who visits the website and intends to fulfill a particular wish of the NGO.

5-06 Amazon – Delivering Smiles:

Besides the Gift a Smile Programme, Amazon India launched the “Delivering Smiles’ program to address the urgent need among students from underserved communities for smart devices for online education in these times of the pandemic by partnering with well-known NGOs. MBKG Pannai was selected as one of the beneficiaries after validation by the Delivering Smiles programme team. We received 30 Tablets and two Desktop computers for the children's online classes. The tablets were used by the 10th and 12th-grade students to attend classes online

6-00 Make A Difference (MAD-VITU):

Make a Difference is a youth-driven, non-profit organization working to ensure better outcomes for children in orphanages and street shelters. MAD's vision is that even the most vulnerable children in society are able to realize equitable outcomes. Enthusiastic engineering students from Vellore Institute of Technology University who are MAD volunteers visit MBKG Pannai on the weekends to help our children. They tutor them in Science and Mathematics.

During the COVID -19 Pandemic, classes were conducted online for the children. We thank the MAD volunteers for investing their devices, time, and effort in our children.

6-01 Visit of Students from Colleges:

Department of Social Work of a few colleges in Vellore send their student to the MBKG Pannai Home for Observational Visit / Field Work for the students' academic purposes. Colleges such as Voorhees College, Auxilium College, Sacred Heart College, Thirupattur, Department of Psychiatry, Christian Medical College and Scudder School of Nursing, Ranipet.



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During their visit the students get firsthand knowledge and experience about the aims, objectives, administrative setup and activities of the organization. Also, they interact with the elders and the children, organize activities for them, show motivational videos and at the end of their visit they conduct Community Programme for the residents of the Home.

6-02 Basketball Coaching for the Home Children:

Mr. Vijayakumar.R, the Accounts Assistant coaches the Home children in Basketball since 2016. Initially, the coaching was only for the boys but in 2020, as the girls were interested in the sport, coaching was started for them as well. Four teams were formed for the girls and boys - junior and senior teams. The home children have participated in many Zonal, Interschool as well as State level tournaments. Recently, our children represented the Vellore District Team and participated in the State level Matches in Chennai, organized by the Tamil Nadu Basketball Association. The organization commends Mr. Vijayakumar for his commitment to coaching the children well and assisting them to participate in state-level competitions.

7-00 King's Matriculation Higher Secondary School:

King's Matriculation Higher Secondary School caters to the educational needs of the children from the Home as well as children from the surrounding Villages. It continues to provide quality education at an affordable cost. The strength for the academic year 2021 – 2022 was 514.

The academic year 2021 -2022 started in the month of September 2021. Due to the covid-19 pandemic, schools were closed in India and regular classes were not taking place. But King's school like the rest of the schools in the district continued online classes. As most of the students are from the MBKG Pannai Home and also from surrounding rural areas, they were not in a position to buy smartphones or laptops for the online classes. While 25% of the students attended online classes, 50% of the students who were unable to attend online classes were given study materials from school to study at home. The remaining students were unable to either attend online classes or collect the materials from the school.

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The annual exams for the lower grades and State board exams for grades 10,11, and 12 were conducted in May 2022.
