In the last 6 months, we admitted 22 children to the Home through the District Child Welfare Committee, Vellore. Children below 6 were placed under Nursery care and the older children to the cottages and the Boys' hostel.

In February 2023 Mrs. P. Sumathi, District Supply and Consumer Protection Officer, Vellore visited the Home. She inspected the General Stores and the Kitchen to sanction the bulk permit for rice and essential commodities. Mrs. Sumathi, interacted with the wardens, cooks, beneficiaries and the staff.



In April 2023, a medical camp for the children was organized by the District Child Welfare Office and the District Child Protection Unit. A team of doctors from Vellore Government Hospital performed medical checkup on 124 children from the age of 2 to 17 and prescribed medication for minor ailments. The team referred a few to Vellore Government Hospital for further intervention.



In June 2023, the District Level Inspection Committee (DLIC) comprising of the Child Welfare Officer, Child Protection Officer and the Probation Officer inspected the Home, checked the registers and interacted with the children and grandmothers.



Visit of Government Officers

Thiru S.J.Chiru, IAS, Principal Secretary, Social Welfare and Women Empowerment, Government of Tamil Nadu visited the Home and interacted with the staff and the beneficiaries. He was greatly impressed with the unique setup and functioning of the Home. He was accompanied by the district Social Welfare Officer





In May 2023, the District Revenue Officer (DRO) Mr. K. Ramamoorthy from the District Collectorate inspected the Home and interacted with the residents. He appreciated the Home Management for the well maintained and satisfactory condition of the Home.







In July 2023, the District Social Welfare Officer (DSWO) Miss. Vinolia. S accompanied by Ms. M. Priya, Deputy Collector (Training) from the Collectorate visited the Home. The officers enquired about the routines of the Home and interacted with the housemothers and the cooks.



Pastor Esther Obasi – ike, (Ph.D) Founder and President of Queen Esther's Generation, a women outreach Ministry, Nairobi, Kenya along with four of her volunteers visited the Home through the kindness of Dr. Roselin from Canada. They donated chairs for the dining hall. The residents were blessed by their visit.

In January 2023, Ms. Anna Hunter from the United Kingdom, visited the Home and the King's School. Her contribution to the school was colossal. She donated funds for the Science Block and the Computer Lab, which was named after her son Sebastian. At the Home side, she supported 20 children in Higher education for a decade. She was accompanied by Mrs. Emma Koshi, a member of MBKG Pannai Society.



Computer Enhanced Learning

A room in the Single Women's Quarters was dedicated for the children's learning through computers. Ten computers received through amazon's Delivering Smiles programme were installed in the room. The children from classes 6 to 12 have a scheduled time for using the computer learning center.







In April 2023, First Aid Class for the Housemothers was organized by the Community Health Nursing Department of College of Nursing, Christian Medical College, Vellore. A team of five Nursing Faculty held a one-day crash course at the Home campus to teach basic first aid with the aid of PowerPoint presentation and with hands on demonstration.



The Women Empowerment Cell of the Kingston Engineering College, Vellore chose MBKG Pannai Home to celebrate Mother's Day with the residents. Dr. U.V. Arivazhagu, Principal of the college along with the staff and students entertained the residents with songs and dance and donated grocery and School Supplies. The theme of the programme was "Smile for a cause".
